Scout Communicator Activity Badge

Tasks (Option 1 - Radio Communications)	Signed off
a. Learn the regulations governing the use of amateur radio equipment.	
b. Visit an amateur radio station.	
c. Log 25 different amateur radio stations. Note the date, time, call sign, frequency, readability and location.	
d. Show how to tune a simple communications receiver.	
e. Give an example of a typical greetings message.	
f. Explain in simple terms how radio waves travel around the world. Learn the more commonly used HF and VHF amateur frequency bands.	
g. Learn the phonetic alphabet and define at least eight international Q code signals.	
h. Show that you can recognise call signs from the UK and near continent.
